The importance of high quality reports cannot be overstated. They are used by both NIFA and the College to justify and advocate for continued investment in the Land-Grant programs. Faculty should spend as much time on these reports as they would when reporting on their competitive grants.

Please be sure to include the results and impacts of your project in the section called "Accomplishments". Only reporting the activities you completed without inclusion of the results, deliverables, and/or measurable impacts will require us to come back to you for additional information. Unfortunately, the federal reporting deadlines have not changed.
